Federal and State Confidentiality Provisions Related to Tribal Cultural Materials/Activities

- **25 USC §3056** -- Nondisclosure of site or resource used for traditional and cultural purposes by an Indian tribe, —U.S. Forest Service/ Department of Agriculture
- **5 USC §552 (b) 4**-- Trade Secrets proprietary exemption in Freedom of Information Act (FOIA)– (confidential information to Tribe, has economic value).
- **16 USC §470w-3** -- Confidentiality of places eligible under the National Historic Preservation act (including “traditional cultural properties”).
- **RCW 42.56.300** --Washington Public Records Act- exemption for information acquired during watershed analysis that identify location of sites of traditional religious, ceremonial or social uses of Indian tribes.
